

The Daylily Garden

This garden features more than 70 cultivars

LOOK FOR:

Spider daylilies: These flowers generally have thin petals that are long and dangly - they look like spider legs hanging down.

Ruffled daylilies: Find the daylily flowers that have a wonderful ruffled edge. This trait has been selected for several years and adds a wonderful dimension to the traditional daylily flower.

Try to find the daylily called "Waite Legacy" named after head gardener Marsha Waite. It is a real beauty!



NOTES:

Volunteers are cross-breeding daylilies, including about a dozen new hybrids that will be registered with the American Hemerocallis Society.

Daylilies bloom from early June through the first of August. They are easy to grow in Southern Oregon, do not require a lot of water, and are not prone to many insect or disease problems.
