

The Lavender Garden

LOOK FOR:

Attractive foliage, beautiful flowers. These plants have a lovely scent and are resistant to drought and deer.

English lavender (*Lavandula angustifolia*) is the most widely grown type of lavender in North America because it tolerates humidity and winter moisture. It is also commonly used in cooking and baking, and has a sweet, soft fragrance.

Variegated lavender varieties have green leaves edged in white. Smell the highly fragrant foliage.
