LOOK FOR:

A pioneer woman's garden that has colorful heritage flowers, fragrant herbs, and plants used medicinally.

The interpretive sign explaining why names of plants have Balm, Bane or Wort in them.

The hop vines growing on the fence; they have historically been used in the development of yeast, fermentation of beverages, and as a sleep aid.

This garden demonstrates how herbs can be used artistically, including the design of paths, areas of interest, a shady sitting spot, and a variety of plant colors, textures, and fragrances.

This garden also attracts birds and pollinators with a water feature and numerous pollinator-friendly plants.
