The Wildflower Garden

Native & non-native flowers, shrubs and grasses

LOOK FOR:

Western clematis $Clematis\ ligustici folia$ – the climbing vine on the trellis. It has lovely fragrant flowers and attracts humming birds.

California fuchsia $Epilobium\ canum$ has tubular red flowers, similar to those of a true fuchsia, but is a different species. Look for it on the rocky cliffs on the way to the southern Oregon coast.

Showy milkweed $Asclepias\ speciosa$ – host plant for the monarch butterfly. Monarchs visit in summer and lay their eggs on leaves. Use the stepping stones to look for a caterpillar eating the leaves.



In bloom from early spring to late fall, this garden attracts bees, butterflies, and hummingbirds.
