

The Wildflower Garden

Native & non-native flowers, shrubs and grasses

LOOK FOR:

Western clematis *Clematis ligusticifolia* – the climbing vine on the trellis. It has lovely fragrant flowers and attracts hummingbirds.

California fuchsia *Epilobium canum* has tubular red flowers, similar to those of a true fuchsia, but is a different species. Look for it on the rocky cliffs on the way to the southern Oregon coast.

Showy milkweed *Asclepias speciosa* – host plant for the monarch butterfly. Monarchs visit in summer and lay their eggs on leaves. Use the stepping stones to look for a caterpillar eating the leaves.

NOTES:

In bloom from early spring to late fall, this garden attracts bees, butterflies, and hummingbirds.

The Wildflower Garden was registered as a Monarch Waystation in 2015 and showcases flowers in our area that are within the California Province of Wildflowers.
