The Jackson County Master Gardener Association (JCMGA) is a non-profit volunteer organization affiliated with the Oregon State University (OSU) Extension Service. The purpose of the Master Gardener Program is to enhance and supplement the OSU Home Horticultural Program and to promote gardening education within the community. JCMGA has limited budgeted funds to promote gardening in Jackson County schools for the 2025-2026 school year.

The purpose of these funds is to encourage interest and education in gardening through the use of hands-on gardening materials, supplies, and small tools in implementing garden projects. Funds are not intended for large, more costly items such as greenhouses, rototillers, or hardscape.

JCMGA is offering an opportunity to Jackson County schools to apply for funds to supplement new or existing gardens and educational materials for horticultural programs. All Jackson County schools preK- 12 may apply. An evaluation process will review all submitted applications and distribute funds according to availability and benefit to your students and others across Jackson County. Be advised that funding is limited; not all projects may be funded. The 2025-2026 school year application deadline is Friday, November 7, 2025. Receipt of your application will be acknowledged. To be considered for this program, your school must submit an application that provides information about your current program or one that you intend to start. Be sure to include background information: advisors, teachers, or volunteers involved and types of activities (seed starting, transplanting, landscaping, vegetable/salad gardening, etc.). Please provide the specific needs of your school program and other information you feel is important for our evaluation of your project.
