The Jackson County Master Gardener Association (JCMGA) is a non-profit volunteer organization affiliated with the Oregon State University (OSU) Extension Service. The purpose of the Master Gardener Program is to enhance and supplement the OSU Home Horticultural Program and to promote gardening education within the community.

The purpose of these funds is to encourage interest and education in gardening through the use of hands-on gardening materials/supplies, and small tools in implementing garden projects and classroom learning projects. Funds are not intended for large, more costly items such as greenhouses, rototillers, or hardscape.

JCMGA is offering an opportunity to Jackson County schools to apply for these funds to supplement new or existing gardens and educational materials for horticultural programs. All Jackson County schools preK - 12 may apply. An evaluation process will review all submitted applications, visit your school site, and distribute funds according to availability and benefit to your students and others across Jackson County. Be advised that funding is limited; not all projects may be funded.

The school year application deadlines are:

- September 15th for Fall & Winter projects
- February 15th for Spring & Summer projects
